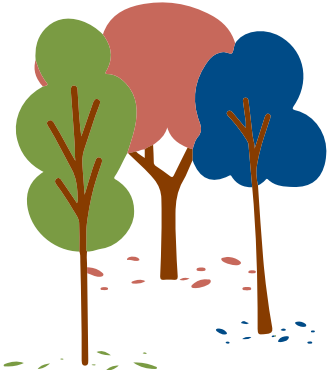

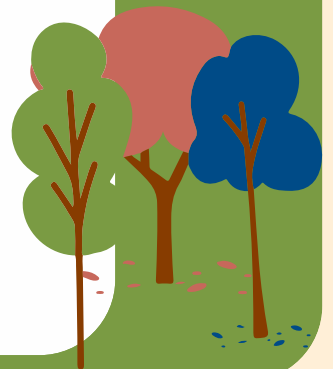
WOW Moments

Hear from our Psychologist

Dr. Kelsey Klindt, a clinical psychologist at ABS Kids in North Carolina, is passionate about helping families better understand their children and providing the tools they need to thrive. With years of experience in autism evaluations, she brings a compassionate and personalized approach to every family she works with.

The Power of Evaluations

Dr. Klindt sees evaluations as more than just a diagnosis; they're an opportunity to uncover a child's unique strengths and challenges. Through in-depth caregiver interviews and playful interactions with children, she gathers valuable insights into how they connect, cope, and navigate the world. This process helps families gain clarity and equips them with actionable steps to support their child's development.

Building Connections Through Play

Play is at the heart of Dr. Klindt's approach. Whether it's putting a toy on her head or being silly to grab a child's attention, she uses play to create a comfortable, low-stress environment. These moments allow her to observe how children interact with both familiar faces, like their caregivers, and new ones, like herself. She reassures families that her goal is not to focus on what's "wrong" but to better understand their child and find ways to help them thrive. Dr. Klindt emphasizes that starting early can make a significant difference in a child's development, helping them build confidence, independence, and skills that will benefit them for years to come. She reminds families that a diagnosis is not a limitation but a tool to unlock opportunities and support tailored to their child's needs.
